#### Taking Action for Afterschool

- WOSTA supports the following budget requests for out-of-school time programs in Wisconsin:
  - DPI's request for \$20 million for out-of-school time programs to address chronic absenteeism.

- A request from Madison Out of School Time for a \$20 million grant program through the Department of Children and Families to expand access to out-of-school time experiences.
- A request from WOSTA/Marshfield Clinic for \$13 million to address children's mental wellness in out of school time programs.
- <u>Contact the governor's office</u> to let him know that you support increased funding for out of school time programs.
- The <u>Wisconsin Partnership for Children and Youth</u> had its first meeting via Zoom on December 11th. A diverse group of 45 advocates from around the state got updates on afterschool and summer policy and discussed the priorities of school age children in out of school time. # **OST Policy and News**

#### Wisconsin News& Legislative Updates:

- State superintendent race kicks off

#### National News & Legislative Updates:

- Congress will likely pass a continuing resolution (CR) to keep the government running through March. The current CR funds the government through 12/20/24. The text will likely be released before the publication of this update.
- The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), introduced in the Senate around Thanksgiving, builds on a bipartisan House bill passed earlier this year. It has leadership support to be included in the upcoming Continuing Resolution, though some Senate holds remain.
  - Key benefits:
  - Expands youth job programs year-round and in summer.
  - Increases involvement of community-based organizations (CBOs), including out-of-school time (OST) programs.
  - Adds afterschool and summer program providers to local workforce boards.
