- December Continuing Resolution (CR): Included in the CR is \$500 million for child care with \$250 million for renovation and repairs of child care facilities that were damaged by natural disasters, as well as temporary services for children in affected areas; and a separate \$250 million for the Child Care and Development Block Grant to increase access to quality child care for working families.
