Wisconsin News& Legislative Updates:

- Childcare Market Share Survey Impacts Childcare Access
- Changes to Wisconsin Shares: In July 2024, significant changes to the
 Wisconsin Shares childcare subsidy program were implemented. The
 initial income eligibility limit was increased to 200% of the Federal Poverty
 Level (FPL), and the copayment calculation for families earning above this
 threshold was adjusted, adding \$1 for every \$5 increase in income.
- DPI Youth Risk Survey for 2023 is now available
- DPI awards grants to community learning centers
- Edgar's summer school offers fun and learning
- The La Crosse YMCA keeps kids fed through the summer months
- Organizations work to steer kids away from violence
- Public education supporters' summit highlights school funding, ways to advocate for more

National News & Legislative Updates:

- FY 25 Appropriations Update: Recently, the Senate Appropriations Committee passed their LHHS spending bill with bipartisan support (25-3). Read a summary.
- The Senate failed last week to pass the bipartisan Tax Relief for American Families and Workers Act (H.R. 7024)—the tax package that includes an expanded Child Tax Credit as well as revived tax cuts for businesses, like research and development deductions.
- Republicans introduced the Child Care and Development Block Grant
 Reauthorization Act of 2024. The bill emphasizes flexible options in a
 mixed delivery system, supporting parent choice, including before-school,
 afterschool, and summer care.
- US Senator Chris Murphy of Connecticut recently announced his intention to introduce a new <u>Summer for All Act</u> which will propose \$4 Billion in new federal funding for summer programs over four years. In addition, Gallup released a new, nationally representative survey of nearly 7,000 parents across the US on the summer experiences of youth. Learn more through this article and infographic.
- ARP ESSER Extensions: Last month, the Department of Education posted <u>quidance</u> on reallocating unused ESSER funds.
